01 Discover Japan



Now, Let's get started with a short introduction of Japan.

Japan at a Glance



I have a question for all. Have you ever been to Japan? Please raise your hand.

As you may know, Japan is located in East Asia. It takes about 12 hours from France to Japan by airplane.

It means that Japan is really far away from here, and Japan has different cultures and features from the ones in Europe.

Japan at a Glance

So let's take a look of the comparison between Spain and Japan.

As you know, the capital city of Spain is Madrid, and the capital city of Japan is Tokyo.

Japan consists of more than 7000 islands and the main ones are Hokkaido, Honshu, Shikoku and Kyusyu.

The population of Japan is approximately 130 million. So there are roughly twice as many people in Japan than Spain.

As for the country's area, Japan has 380,000 sq. kms and it is about half of the Spain.

So you can see Japan's population density is very high.

There are also many forests in Japan. Japan is one of the world's most heavily forested countries. (Forests cover about 70% of the land.)

Why Japan?

World Class Research

52 univ. are ranked within the top 1000

So when you think about doing your research in foreign countries, you have so many choices, such us the United States, China or other European countries. From all the choices you have, why is Japan a good place to pursue your research? I have three reasons to convince you.

First of all, we have a lot of world class universities, especially in the field of science and technology.

41 universities are ranked within the top 1000 of QS World University Rankings. For example, the University of Tokyo is the top university in Japan and is ranked 10th to 13th in the world especially in Physics, Astronomy and Chemistry. Secondly, I believe Japanese culture is fascinating.

You can find Japanese foods and Japanese restaurants in France, too. But it is completely different from the ones in Japan.

Have you ever seen this kind of sushi in France? Probably not.

Other than the food, you can also see Japanese cultures and images on the internet, but I think what you see and feel in Japan will be deeper or can be different from what you know now.

And third, livability. Even at midnight in Japan, I am comfortable walking alone. Japan is relatively safe with a very secure infrastructure, meaning you can focus on pursuing your research activities.

Many potential hosts in Japan

Some of you here already are interested in conducting your research in Japan, but you may not know where in Japan you can go for your research.

But, you do not have to worry about it, because there are many potential hosts in Japan.

You may be surprised that Japan has around 800 universities.

We have 82 national, 94 public and 592 private universities.

I heard that there are about 80 universities in Spain in total.

So obviously you have many choices in Japan.

How to find a host/ a counterpart

Your connections and networks

- Your supervisor
- Member of the universities for joint research in your lab
- Any researchers you know in Japan

And now you may have the question "How can I find my host or counterpart from so many choices?" We will talk about it later, but you will need to find your host researchers or counterpart institutions in Japan to apply for most of the JSPS programs.

Unfortunately, there is not a crucial answer for this, but first, we recommend you to use your own networks. Secondly, we introduce some useful websites to search online.

Here are the useful websites for searching your host researcher in Japan.

Research map is a good tool to search a researcher in Japan. You can search by key words, research field, names, institutions and so on.

What is JSPS?

Japan Society for the Promotion of Science

- Established in 1932
- Japan's core funding agency
- The largest one with the longest history in Japan


JSPS, stands for Japan Society for the Promotion of Science. In Japanese, our name is "日本学術振興会", and many Japanese call us "がくしん"

JSPS was established in 1932.

It is Japan's core funding agency. We provide research funds to the universities and research institutes.

We are the largest funding agency with the longest history in Japan.

Positioning of JSPS



This slide shows the framework of the science & technology policy system in Japan.

JSPS is a national funding agency under the ministry of education, culture, sport, science and technology.

We call it MEXT for short. MEXT is positioned under the Cabinet Office. MEXT is responsible for the whole education in Japan, from pre-school through university and lifelong learning programs.

Features of JSPS Funding

All the research areas supported

- Fundamental to applied research
- Based on the curiosity-driven research and the free ideas of researchers
- Covers the entire spectrum of academic research

Fair and transparent process for funding

- Bottom-up approach for application and selection
- Competitive funding though open calls
- Fair and transparent screening

Here's our values and styles.

First, we cover all fields, not only the natural sciences but also humanity and social sciences.


Secondly, in the application and selection phase, we take a bottom-up approach in supporting curiosity-driven research, and invite applications through open calls.

Applications are evaluated via peer review and selected based on their academic or scientific merit.

Budgets of JSPS

- FY 2022: **266** billion yen ≈ **€ 2 billion**
- Over 99% is from the Japanese Government
- Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research





I would like to talk a bit about our budget. For 2022, our budget was about 2 billion euros. Over 99% coming from the Japanese government.

Our biggest funding program is Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research, which we call "KAKENHI."

KAKENHI is the largest competitive funding program in Japan and covers all scientific fields.

About 80 thousand projects were awarded last year.

International Activities for JSPS

Five Pillars

- 1. Create the world-class knowledge in diverse fields
- **2. Foster the next generation researchers** who challenge to create new genres of knowledge
- 3. Improve the education/research functions that leverage the strengths of universities, etc.
- 4. Build the robust international research bases

And, to build robust international research bases.


So based on these ideas and goals, we offer various kinds of international programs for researchers in the world. And that's why we are here today to introduce these programs to you and your community.




This is our latest brochure which is available today.

JSPS International Programs



All researchers in the world in any academic field are welcome to have a research opportunity in Japan.

Our international programs can be categorized into 3 types, individual exchanges, group to group collaboration and institution to institution collaboration.

To begin, I would like to introduce our programs for individual researchers.

JSPS Fellowships (individual)

We welcome you to Japan

Japanese universities and research institutions host outstanding researchers from other countries with financial support by JSPS.

If you become a JSPS fellow...



With our individual fellowship programs, researchers from other countries will be hosted at Japanese universities or research institutions. And JSPS supports those researchers financially.


If you get the fellowship, and become a JSPS fellow,

(Examples)

- You can conduct joint research in Japan
- You can exchange opinions with Japanese researchers and researchers from other countries who are living in Japan
- Also, you have the opportunity to participate in outreach activities,
- Finally, you receive support to help you thrive during your stay in Japan

So this is a great opportunity for researchers in France to have a research connection with Japan!

JSPS Fellowships (individual)



As you can see there are 5 types of fellowship programs for researchers at all career stages, from phD students to senior professors, on a short or long term basis.

Application Procedures

- Researchers who belong to any research institution or university are able to apply through CNRS.
- All the candidates are evaluated under the same criteria.



It is very important to prepare well with your host researcher in Japan.

Before talking about each programs, I would like to introduce our basic system of accepting your application.

There are 2 ways to apply. The first one is in France through CNRS which candidates submit by themselves. Regardless of your affiliated university or institution, your application is evaluated under the same criteria as CNRS and JSPS. Another way to apply is in Japan. Your host researcher submits the application to JSPS Tokyo. So please make sure to communicate well with your host researcher.

These ways vary from program to program.

If there are 2 ways to apply, you can submit two applications at the same time to increase your chances of obtaining the fellowship, but in case both are accepted, you will have to withdraw one of them.

Our Summer Program is for pre and post-doc researchers.

The program runs from June to August, but you can extend your stay in Japan up to 120 days including your fellowship tenure.

The purpose of this program is to introduce young researchers to Japan and provide them with an opportunity to conduct research in there. Through this program, you can attend orientation about Japanese culture and you can even experience a homestay with a Japanese family.

Then you will conduct your research with your host researcher at a Japanese university or research institute.

Around 15 French Researchers are selected for this program and the deadline is in December every year.

In order to join this program, you need to find your host researcher in Japan first, and your application must be submitted to CNRS.

CNRS accepts applications from all researchers who do not belong to CNRS or CNRS research units.

The call for application for the 2024 program will open this month so please check the website of CNRS.

Okay, so now I am going to explain each program briefly. The second one is Postdoctoral Fellowship for Foreign Researchers, Short-term.

In order to apply for this program, you must be enrolled in a PhD course and be scheduled to obtain a PhD within 2 years. Or, you must have obtained a PhD within the past 6 years.

Financial support includes a round-trip air ticket, insurance and a maintenance allowance depending on your degree. A settling-in allowance will also be provided. In addition to these, your host researcher can apply for a research budget of 70,000 Yen (=450 euros) per month for you.

Once selected, you can stay in Japan from 1 month up to 1 year. It depends on you and your host researcher's research plan.



Here is some information about short-term postdoctoral fellowship applications.

For the in-France application, the call for the 2024 program is not yet open. But for your information, in 2023, 13 fellowships were awarded and the deadline was at the beginning of November.

You can apply from Japan as well. The call for applications for 2024 is now open. We accept applications 3 times a year according to the fellowship period.

To apply for the Standard Postdoctoral Fellowship program, you must have obtained a PhD degree in the past 6 years.

So doctoral course students cannot apply for this program.

With this program, you can stay in Japan between 1 and 2 years.



Now let's discuss two programs for researchers with a longer career.

Invitational Fellowship p.15 <Long-Term> For Mid-Career and senior Researchers Candidate eligible • Fulltime researcher (professor, associate professor or assistant professor) OR Researchers obtained doctorate degree at least 6 years ago and conduct research continuously • Nationalities: All countries having diplomatic relations with Japan **Period** 2-10 months Financial Support · Round-trip air ticket and insurance Maintenance allowance/month: ¥387,600 (€ 2586)

The first one is the Long-term Invitational Fellowship.

This fellowship is mainly for mid-career and senior researchers holding a full-time position in a university or non-profit research institute.

Financial support is shown here.

You can visit Japan and conduct your research for 2 to 10 months with your host researcher.

60 researchers from around the world will be invited to Japan with this program for FY2024.

The short-term invitational fellowship is especially intended for **mid-career** and senior researchers unable to take a long leave. Financial support is shown here. The program period is from 14 to 60 days.



So that was the explanation for 5 programs. Through these fellowships, many French researchers visit Japan every year. Unfortunately, due to Covid 19, the number of researchers visiting Japan declined in 2020 and 2021. However, we expect to have more researchers in the future.

So we would recommend that as many of you as possible apply, and as early as possible.


The ratio of open recruitment is available on the website. For the Short-term, it is 25 to 35%. For Standard, it is 10%. Long-term Invitation fellowships are 38% and short are 45%

Now that we've introduced the individual programs.


Let's move onto the 2nd level, Bilateral programs.



There are two bilateral programs available for researchers in France.

Here is our most basic program for supporting bilateral collaboration.

JSPS has bilateral programs in the form of joint research projects and seminars based on MoUs, with French counterpart agencies such as INSERM and MEAE-MESR.




The SAKURA program is with the French Foreign Ministry and Ministry of Higher Education and Research..

This program is for researchers who are under 46 years old.

The deadline for 2024 is September 5th.


Another bilateral program offered by JSPS is called "Open Partnership Joint Projects/Seminars."

Any funding agencies can be counterparts of JSPS. They do not have to have a MoU with JSPS.


Support from JSPS to Japanese researchers is shown here.

So if you have any connection and joint research plan with Japanese researchers, these would be good programs to apply to.

Finally, let's discuss the Multilateral collaboration program.



Under the JSPS Core-to-Core program, scientific collaborations are carried out among core research institutions in at least three countries as shown here.


This program forges International Collaboration in Cutting-edge Fields, creates World-class Research Hubs and fosters young researchers.

Japan funds18 million yen per project for 5 years. Please note that partner institutions are required to cover their own expenses.

Here's a list of the names of the universities in France which join the core-to-core programs running now.

If you are already involved in a big project, and are strongly connected with a Japanese university or institution, this is a good program for you. The call for applications for 2024 is just closed. So please wait for the next call. Again the host institutions in Japan apply to JSPS, and the deadline is October 2nd.

JSPS International Programs



Now that you've seen all three categories, you may choose to start with an individual or short program, then , apply to a bilateral or multilateral program.

You are free to apply several times in your career and you are always welcome in Japan.
